

# National Telehealth Foundation School Mental Health Grant Program



## DESCRIPTION

Grants funding to USA K-12 school districts that are supported by organizations that provide comprehensive mental health services for students and workforce development in and for the grant receiving district. Eligible expenses include but are not limited to third-party providers, technology, and partnership guidance.

Funding will be considered and based on the following needs of service:

- Number of school kids engaged
- Current counselor staffing
- Workforce/pipeline development targets
- Community impact
- Technology needs
- Local partnership needs
- Third-party provider needs
- Foundation resource support

## GRANT RULES

- A clear focus related directly to providing mental health services for kids K-12 and/or workforce development of mental health professional development.
- Applicant school districts focus mental services services to all students in need.
- Applicant school districts must express willingness to participate in ongoing workforce development for future mental health professionals.
- Applicant school districts are limited to a maximum of one three year grant, one per year
- Each grant has a maximum of three (3) year duration with funding caps provided annually per calendar year.
- Funds must be spent on the items proposed in the original application.
- Grants are based on available funds and previous commitments
- Grantees must provide quarterly reporting throughout the term of the grant. Details to be provided.

Applications are generally accepted on a quarterly basis and responded within sixty days of acceptance.

Note: Grant Proposals must be complete and submitted by the grant submission period close date to be considered. All grant proposals must be submitted electronically via email or via the online application database. No paper submissions will be accepted.

## **APPLICATIONS WILL BE EVALUATED BASED ON THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA**

- **Clarity:** Does the proposal clearly articulate specific, attainable, and measurable goals for mental health for kids grade K-12 and/or workforce development for future mental health professionals?
- **Relevance:** Is the proposal based on appropriate mental health content?
- **Scope:** Does the proposal encompass a diversity of students and workforce development professionals?
- **Collaboration:** Is the proposal open to community partnerships and initiatives to address kids grade K-12 and/or workforce development for future mental health professionals?
- **Impact:** Is the proposal sustainable, and will it have a broad and lasting mental health benefits within the school and community?
- **Structure:** Does the proposal have a sustainable and reasonable approach in which to achieve its stated objectives for mental health and workforce development?
